Wedding Stationery

At Home Cards: Informs family & friends of your new address, if you are moving to a new home. It also lets them know whether you are keeping your maiden name. At home cards are usually mailed with an announcement or mailed to those who were not invited to either the ceremony and/or reception. Do not mail with the thank you card—mail separately after the wedding.

Accommodation Card: Detailed information regarding your hotel. Consisting of block rate, booking date and directions. Can also be used to inform guests if you are providing transportation to and from various locations.

Direction Card: Detailed instructions enclosed with the invitation to provide insurance against guests getting lost and/or missing the ceremony and/or reception.

Engagement Announcements: If you want to share the exciting news, plan an announcement using a wedding invitation format. Either formal or informal is proper.

Menus: Provided either per table or per plate. It informs your guests of the meal being served.

Offset Printing: Flat, non dimensional printing

Place Cards: Lists guests name and table name or number for a formal sit down meal.

Reception Card: This invitation says "you are special" to your guest. Mailed along with your wedding invitation this card announces the time and location of your reception.

Response Card with Printed Envelope or Response Postcard: It is a thoughtful way to ease your guest's responsibility to reply to your invitation. As a courtesy to guests, enclose a stamped, self addressed envelope with your card or postcard.

Save the Date: It is a good idea to give friends & family as much notice as possible of the upcoming event. This is especially true if you have many out of town guests or if you plan on having a destination wedding. They should be mailed 5 months in advance of the wedding or 7 months for lots of out of town guests or destination weddings.

Thermography: Process which produces raised lettering with powder fused by heat to the fresh ink.

Thank You Note/Card: It is a thoughtful way to let gift givers know their gift was received and appreciated. People who took time to pick out a wedding gift deserve a personalized thank you note or card regardless if you have thanked them verbally. Send within two months of the wedding.

Wedding Announcements: Used if your circle of friends & family is larger than the list you intend to invite to the ceremony and reception, or if you have a private wedding. Announcements include the wedding date, but never the time or location and are typically mailed the day of the wedding.

Wedding Programs: Not only do they provide a nice memento of your wedding, but they allow your guests to follow the ceremony and learn who is in your bridal party. Enables you to share a special message or poem with your guests.
